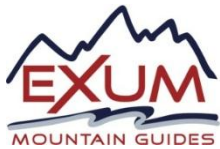

Depending on snow conditions and group ability, we will finish climbing club with a climb where we will put all the skills we learned together on a summit attempt. All climbing gear will be provided.

Difficulty Rating: Moderate to Strenuous; hiking, climbing and scrambling up to 10,000'. Summit day could include early morning departure, 6-8 mile round trip with high elevation gain and loss.

Circumnavigation of Yellowstone Lake

Explore a part of Yellowstone that most people never see. Travel to areas open only to paddle craft where there is abundant wildlife, geo-thermal features, amazing scenery and solitude.

Mad River Boat Trips provides rafts and guides for the final two days which includes floating from Wilson to South Park, camping along the way and then paddling through the Snake River Canyon whitewater.

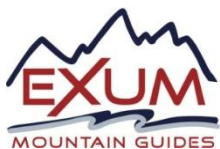

Stand Up Paddle Boarding Class on the Snake River



Stand Up Paddle Boarding (SUP) is the fastest growing

water sport in the world. Rendezvous River Sports will provide instruction, boards, paddles, wet suits, booties, lifejackets, helmets and transportation. Participants should bring a swimsuit, towel, change of clothes, water, snacks and sunscreen.

Snake River Instruction begins with flat and moving water skills on Flat Creek above its confluence with the Snake River. Next you will learn the basics of river safety and river features. Once on the river, we will cover board edge and angle, learn how to carve into eddies, ferry across the current and even surf small waves. We will paddle on Class 1 and II moving water, depending on river levels, and will paddle 6-9 miles.
